In November 2020, Gurbaz Sangha, a 26-year-old Indian farmer, traveled 400 kilometers on his tractor from his native Punjab to the outskirts of Delhi. Like him, hundreds of thousands of men and women from all castes, religions, and generations rallied to the capital with one goal: to oppose the agrarian reform imposed by the government of Narendra Modi.

The protesters set up camp at the four «borders» - the key entry points to Delhi's ring road. Despite the government's contempt and increasingly violent police harassment, they stayed, season after season, and revealed a plural, courageous, and beautifully inventive India. After 14 months of an epic struggle, marked by a series of police raids that cost 720 lives, the farmers won. Farming the Revolution offers a breathtaking immersion into the heart of the most impressive social and political movement of our time.

Kim YIP TONG


Pie dan lo
